State Fiddle Contest Date Change SEPT 5-6

Dear Fiddle Participants,

We are thrilled to welcome you back to Payson for the **55th Annual Fiddle Contest**, held on **9/5-9/6/2025** as part of the **Northern Gila County Fair!** Please find attached the **event schedule** and **updated contest rules** for your reference. **CLICK HERE FOR SCHEDULE and RULES.** https://adventurepayson.com/fiddle/

This year, a few important updates have been made regarding check-in, parking, and fair entry:

- Check-In & Parking Pass: All fiddlers must check in at the Parks and Recreation tent (look for the
 purple tent near the fair ticket booth) to receive a parking pass valid for the entire weekend. This
 pass must be displayed on the dashboard of any vehicle transporting a contestant (one pass per
 vehicle with a contestant).
- Additional Vehicles: Any other vehicles may either pay the \$5 parking fee or park for free at the Mazatzal Casino across the highway and use the provided shuttle service.
- Fair Entry Wristbands: Contestants will receive free entry wristbands for themselves and two
 guests. These will be issued at check-in and will be valid for the entire weekend.
 - The Fair Entry fee is \$5 for all others who do not apply to the contestant and two guests criteria
- Registration: You can register by calling 928-472-5110 or online at www.paysonparks.com Inperson registration opens at 8:00 AM on Thursday, September 4th at the Parks and Recreation tent.
- Camping: A few dry camping spots are still available. Please register as soon as possible to reserve a space.

The Northern Gila County Fair is celebrating Kids Day on Thursday, September 4th. Kids gain entry for free prior to 3pm. There will also be a special opening ceremony celebrating the brave men and women who served in the military. 




The song commemorates the surrender of the town of Carlisle to Prince Charles Edward Stuart, on 18 November 1745, when he invaded England, He entered Carlisle on a white horse, with a hundred pipers playing before him. Greetings from sunny Baja Arizona,

Things have slowed down to a crawl here as they do every year this time. The monsoon rains seem to be arriving on schedule and each afternoon is filled with the hope of much needed rain.

The Southern Arizona Chapter Weekly Jam has been very well attended with an average of 12 to 15 musicians each week. The audience, though sparse, is very enthusiastic and appreciative.

As I mentioned in a previous newsletter, the **2026 Tucson Fiddle Contest is scheduled for Saturday Feb 21, 2026.** This will be our 84th annual contest. This contest has been held continuously since at least 1941 except for the interruption caused by the covid epidemic.

Due to my advancing age, health and other issues, 2026 will be the last year I will be able to serve as Contest Coordinator. If this contest is to continue beyond this coming year, someone will need to step up and serve in this capacity.

While it would be preferable for someone from the Tucson area to fill this position, it could be done by someone not living here. Most of the contest business can be conducted by email, phone or snail mail. The only day it would be necessary to be in Tucson is the day of the contest.

At present, we have a very good venue partner in the Southern Arizona Square and Round dance Association. We also have a very loyal and dedicated group of volunteers. Funding is currently being provided by donations from the AOTFA, chapters of the AOTFA, and the personal generosity of the many friends of Fiddling in Arizona.

The Tucson Fiddle Contest is the oldest continuous fiddle contest in Arizona and probably the entire United States. If this contest cannot continue it will represent a major loss to Old Time Fiddling in Arizona. Please let me hear from you if you want to help carry on this tradition.

Famous Fiddlers



Kenny Baker (June 26, 1926 – July 8, 2011) played fiddle with Bill Monroe for 25 years, and was one of the most influential bluegrass fiddlers. He started playing professionally with country artist Don Gibson in the 1950s, and later joined the Bluegrass Boys. Baker put out many record albums, and his recordings were learned and adapted by all kinds of fiddlers.

We hear his tunes in nearly every fiddle contest. Some of his best known are Festival Waltz, Jerusalem Ridge, Lonesome Moonlight Waltz, Road to Columbus, Roxanne Waltz and Washington County.



Katrina Nicolayeff is an internationally renowned fiddle player and multi-talented musician and teacher. She plays left handed on a standard fiddle.

Katrina began learning old-time fiddle tunes under the guidance of her mother, Bobbie Pearce, a highly accomplished fiddler, and respected teacher. This prepared Katrina to compete in her first fiddle contest at 2 years old. As a child, Katrina won numerous contests nationwide, including 3 National Champion titles in the Small Fry, Junior Junior, and Junior divisions, at the National Oldtime Fiddlers' Contest in Weiser, Idaho.

Katrina was "Grand Champion" of the National Old Time Fiddler's Contest (Weiser, ID) six times and the Grand Masters Contest (Nashville) four times. She has taught music and performed all over the USA and Canada and played at the White House and Grand Ole Opry.
